Founded in 2006, Montréal Roller Derby (MTRLRD) is the very first flat track roller derby league in Canada. Today, MTRLRD comprises three home teams and two travel teams. In January 2009, MTRLRD joined the Women's Flat Track Derby Association, becoming the first non-American league in the association. We are extremely honoured to be able to host a WFTDA Playoff tournament for the first time, especially as this is the 10th year anniversary of our league! The MTRLRD players, referees, coaches, announcers, and volunteers are excited to make your time in Montreal the best it can be. We have put together an info packet of awesome things to do/see/eat during your time in Montreal.

HOW GET TO THE VENUE

BY AIR

All international and domestic flights fly into Montréal–Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport. It's approximately 30 km (17 miles) from the venue and accessible by car, taxi, and public transport.

BY BUS:

Buses into the city arrive at the Montreal Central Station—Gare d'autocars de Montréal (1717 Rue Berri). It's a 25 minute cab ride to the venue. There's also a nearby metro station.

BY TRAIN

Trains arrive in the city at the Gare Centrale at 895 Rue de la Gauchetière O. It's about 9 km (5 miles) to the venue, and is accessible by car and public transport.

BY CAR

From the airport: Follow signs for Autoroute 20 E. Merge onto 720 E. Continue onto Viger Avenue E, which turns into Notre-Dame E. Turn left onto Boulevard Pie-IX. Turn right onto Sherbrooke E. Turn right on Rue Viau.

From the North: Take Autoroute 15 S onto the island. Take left lane to Autoroute 40 E. Take exit 76 toward Boulevard Pie-IX. Merge onto Cremazie which turns into Metropolitain E. Use right lane to take Boulevard Viau N ramp, turn right onto Viau. Continue straight until venue.

From the East: Take Autoroute 40 O towards Montreal. Take exit 80S for Autoroute 25S. Take exit 5 toward Rue Sherbrooke, use right two lanes to take ramp to Rue Sherbrooke. Turn left on Rue Viau.

From the South: From Autoroute 10 O, take exit 6 and follow signs for Autoroute 20 E. Take exit 82 and follow signs for Pont Jacques Cartier (Bridge) - Montreal. Turn right on Rue Sherbrooke E. Turn right on Rue Viau.

From the West: From the Transcanada, take Pont de l'île aux Tourtes (Bridge) onto Autoroute 40 E. Take exit 76 towards Boulevard Pie-IX - Boulevard Viau. Merge onto Cremazie which turns into Metropolitain E. Use right lane to take Boulevard Viau N ramp, turn right onto Viau. Continue straight until venue.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

You will need a valid passport (or NEXUS card) to cross the USA-Canada border whether it's by air, train, bus, or car. You will not be allowed over the border if you do not have one.

HOW TO GET TO HOTELS

Hotel Lord Berri

FROM THE NORTH

Take Autoroute 15 S toward Montreal. Take middle lane to Autoroute 40 E and take exit to QCC-335/Boulevard de l'Acadie/Boulevard St-Laurent/Rue St-Denis. Keep right at fork onto Rue Cremazie O, continue onto Rue Cremazie E. Turn right on Rue St-Denis, continue 6 km (3.7 miles). Turn left on Rue Cherrier. Turn right on Rue Berri. Hotel Lord Berri is on the left.

FROM THE SOUTH

From Jacques-Cartier Bridge: From QC-134 E, get on Pont Jacques Cartier Bridge. Use right two lanes to take exit toward Autoroute 720 - Downtown. Continue onto Avenue de Lorimier. Turn right onto Boulevard Rene-Levesque E. Turn right onto Rue Berri.

From Champlain Bridge: From Autoroute 10 O, get on Champlain Bridge. Use right two lanes to take exit 58 for Autoroute 10 O toward Downtown. Continue onto Boulevard Robert-Bourassa. Turn right on Rue Saint Antoine O which becomes Rue Saint Antoine E. Turn left onto Rue Berri.

FROM THE EAST

From Autoroute 40 O, use left two lanes to take exit 80S to merge onto Autoroute 25S. Take exit 4 toward Montreal - Centre ville. Continue onto Avenue Souigny. Turn left on Rue Dickson. Turn right onto Rue Notre-Dame E which becomes Avenue Viger E, take Viger exit. Turn right onto Rue Berrie.

FROM THE WEST

From Autoroute 40 E, take exit toward Autoroute 15 S toward Autoroute 10 - Centre Ville. Take left lane for exit 63E for Autoroute 720 E toward Centre Ville. Take exit 6 toward Rue Berri. Keep right at fork for Rue Berri. Turn left onto Rue Berri.

From Autoroute 15 S, use left lane to merge onto Autoroute 40 E exit. Take exit 75 and turn right onto Boulevard Saint-Michel. Turn left onto Boulevard Rosemont. Turn right onto Boulevard Langelier E. Turn left onto Rue Sherbrooke E.

FROM THE SOUTH

From the Jacques-Cartier Bridge: From QC-134 E continue onto Rue de Lormier. Turn right onto Rue Sherbrooke E. Straight for 6.8 km (4.2 miles).

FROM THE EAST

From Autoroute 40 O, use left two lanes to take exit 80S for Autoroute 25S. Take exit 5 and follow signs to Rue Sherbrooke O. Turn right onto Rue Des Groseilliers. Turn left onto Rue Faradon. Turn left onto Rue Radisson. Turn left onto Rue Sherbrooke E.

FROM THE WEST

From Autoroute 40 E, cross island, take exit 80S for Autoroute 25S. Take exit 5 and follow signs to Rue Sherbrooke O. Turn right onto Rue Des Groseilliers. Turn left onto Rue Faradon. Turn left onto Rue Radisson. Turn left onto Rue Sherbrooke E.

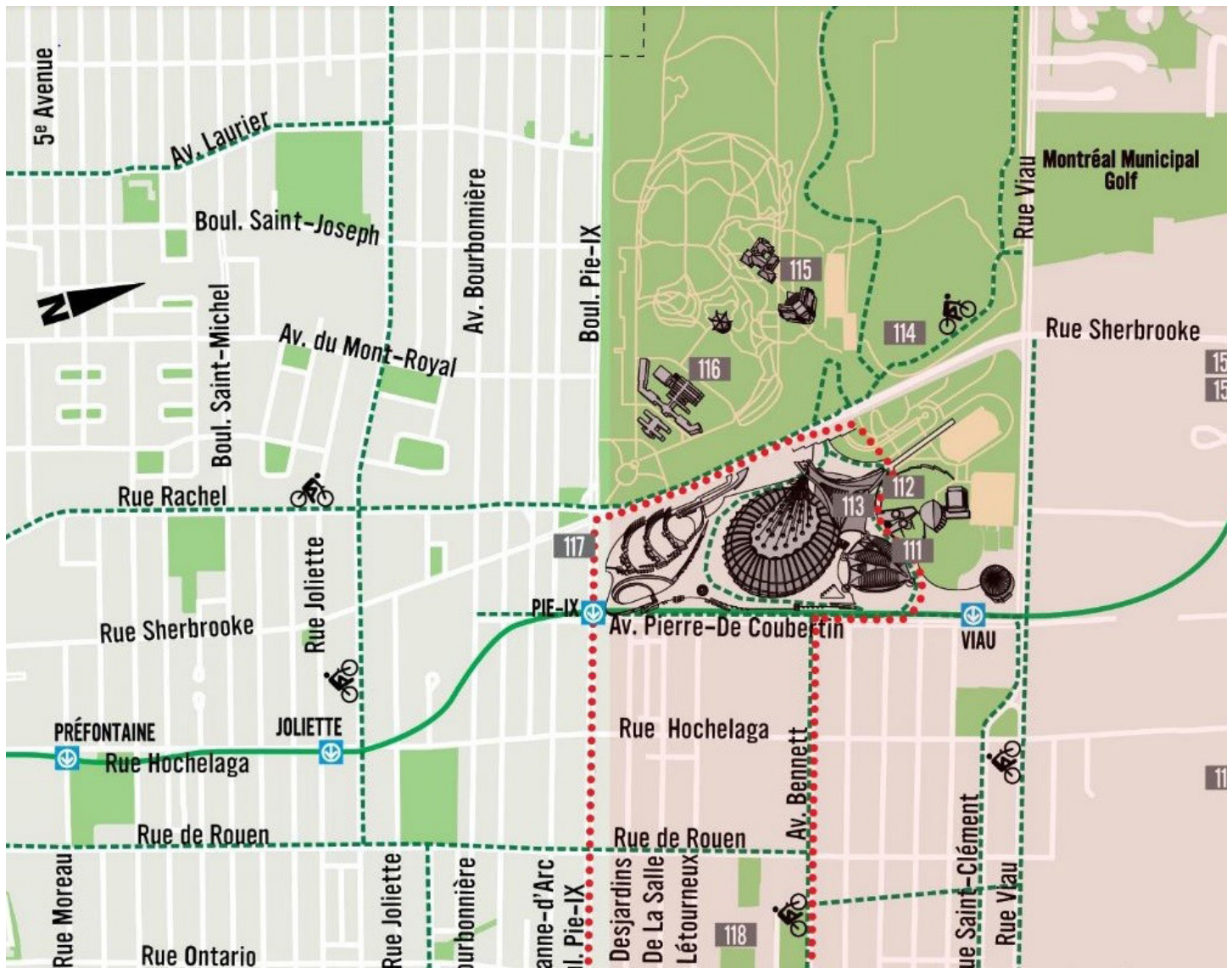

Centre Pierre-Charbonneau is a sports arena located at Olympic Park in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. Built in 1957, the Centre holds 2,700 people. It is the former home of the Montreal Jazz (National Basketball League of Canada), the Montreal Royal (American Basketball Association), and the Montreal Sasquatch (Premier Basketball League). The Centre hosts various conventions, exhibitions, and sporting events, and was the host of for the wrestling events at the 1976 Summer Olympics, which were the first to be hosted in Canada. We will be a few minutes away from the up-and-coming neighborhood of Hochelaga-Maisonneuve, where you will be able to find shops, restaurants, and services. There is also easy access to a metro station, which will easily get you to downtown Montreal or one of the city's many other interesting neighborhoods.

HOW TO GET TO THE VENUE

From Lord Berri Hotel

By CAR: Go south of Rue Berri, turn right onto Rue Viger. Continue straight and Viger becomes Rue Notre-Dame E. Turn left onto Boulevard Pie-IX. Turn right onto Rue Sherbrooke E. Turn right onto Rue Viau.

By METRO: Take Green line, direction Honore-Beaugrand to Viau station.

From Auberge Versaille

By CAR: Take Rue Sherbrooke E heading West. Turn left onto Rue Viau.

By METRO: Walk to Station Radisson, get on green line, direction Angrignon. Get off at Station Viau.

PARKING

There is a paid parking (12\$/day) in front of the venue. Finding free street parking in the area is not easy, so we recommend taking public transport

SECURITY

There will be hired security personnel and volunteer security staff from the Montreal Roller Derby League to attend to crowd control and general security matters. You are advised not to leave valuables unattended as neither the WFTDA, the Montreal Roller Derby League, nor the Centre Pierre-Charbonneau will be responsible for loss, damage, or theft of your belongings. Any property you bring to the event is at your own risk.

VENUE FOOD AND BEVERAGE

No outside food or beverage will be allowed into the venue.

RULES AND RESTRICTIONS

- All purses, bags, and cases are subject to search.
- In accordance with the Centre Pierre-Charbonneau ordinances, smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in all public areas at the Centre Pierre-Charbonneau including the arena and concourse. A designated outdoor smoking area will be provided.
- Any item that is dangerous, hazardous and/or illegal, or that may be used as a weapon, compromise or otherwise interfere with the enjoyment, comfort, or safety of any person or pose risk to security at the venue, or any other item that WFTDA event officials or Centre Pierre-Charbonneau officials determine (in their absolute discretion) may cause injury or public nuisance or inconvenience to any other person is strictly prohibited.
- No animals other than guide, signal, or service animals (as defined by law) are allowed in Centre Pierre-Charbonneau. All sanitary needs for permitted animals are the responsibility of the customer.

SEATING INFORMATION

- Seating is on a first come, first served basis. There will be stadium seating and limited track-side floor seating. No reserved seating or VIP seating is offered for this tournament.
- No carry-in chairs are permitted.
- Chairs are not permitted trackside except as a companion to ADA accessible seating. Wheelchairs (and their companion chair) must be a minimum of five feet away from the outside referee line.
- In order to sit trackside, you must be at least 18 years old. If you do not have a valid photo ID to verify your age, you will be required to move.
- We expect high attendance at the tournament and seating areas to be full. Do not "save seats" for individuals who are not returning to their seats momentarily. You will be asked to remove skate bags, backpacks, and other large items from the seating area in order to make room to accommodate others. Participant bags may be left in the participant-only area (locker rooms). Please be considerate and allow others to sit if a seat is not actively being occupied.

ENTRY AND RE-ENTRY

Doors open daily at 9:00 AM.

Games begin at 10:00 AM.

Your tickets will be scanned and/or taken at the entrance to the arena. For same day re-entry, you will need a wristband. Do not leave the arena without a wristband if you wish to re-enter.

NOTES AND ADDITIONAL FEES

- Convenience and handling fees are added to these prices (typically by phone or online).
- Friday and Saturday evening tickets are for entry at 5:00 PM.
- Sunday evening tickets are for entry at 3:00 PM.
- Discounts for active military personnel are available in person wherever tickets are sold.
- Children 8 years old and younger are always free with a ticketed and supervising adult! While admission is free for children 8 years old and younger, a child ticket will be required upon entry to track venue capacity, so please be sure to obtain one from the ticketing site.

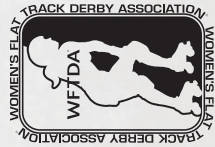

WFTDA TOURNAMENT RULES

PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF A FEW TOURNAMENT RULES

- No video or audio recording devices or cameras with detachable lenses without prior approval from the WFTDA. Please visit wftda.com/tournaments/credentials for more information.
- If you choose to sit trackside, you accept all responsibility for the possible risk of injury to you, or damage and/or destruction to your belongings at any time without warning. Trackside seating is at your own risk.
- Chairs are not permitted trackside except as a companion to ADA accessible seating. Wheelchairs (and their companion chair) must be a minimum of five feet away from the outside referee lane.
- Glassware, sharp objects, and other items deemed inappropriate, harmful, or hazardous by tournament staff are not allowed in trackside seating.
- You must remain seated in the trackside seating area. Laying down is not permitted. Keep your hands, feet, and belongings behind the safety line at all times. Do not touch or grab skaters or officials who fall into trackside seating. If a piece of clothing or equipment falls onto the track, do not enter the track or safety lane to retrieve it.
- Fire lanes, exits, and walkways must remain clear.
- Certain areas of the track and venue are reserved for individuals who require special seating or perform specific game duties. They may obstruct the view of persons behind them. However, they are not able to move, sit, squat, or otherwise alter their position lest they not be able to complete their job function.
- By entering the venue, you agree to the possibility of being photographed, filmed, or recorded. Your voice, image, and likeness may be captured and recorded in and around the venue and publicly disseminated by any means and in any format or media. You waive all rights on an irrevocable, worldwide, perpetual basis to object to such recording and dissemination.

GUEST CODE OF CONDUCT

The Women's Flat Track Derby Association strives to provide a safe and satisfying event for everyone in attendance by seeking your compliance with our guest code of conduct. We ask for your assistance in creating an environment that is free of:

- Abusive or foul language and obscene gestures directed toward other guests, venue employees, tournament staff and volunteers, players, coaches, and officials.
- Guests who are disruptive to the event or impair other guests' enjoyment.
- Intoxicated or drug-impaired individuals.
- Smoking, except in designated areas (located outside of the arena).
- Prohibited entry items such as outside food and beverage, weapons, non-service animals, air horns, vuvuzelas, megaphones, and laser pointers, and other items deemed inappropriate, harmful, or hazardous by tournament staff.
- Professional cameras, video cameras, and audio recorders are prohibited without prior authorization and proper credentials.
- Guests without proper authorization or credentials entering or attempting to enter restricted areas.
- Banners or signs that obstruct the view of guests, obscure sponsor advertising, contain objectionable subject matter, or are commercial in nature. The WFTDA and the venue reserve the right to remove any banner or sign at any time.

Guests not abiding by this Guest Code of Conduct are subject to ejection from the venue. In the event that you are refused entry into or requested to leave the venue for failure to comply with the Guest Code of Conduct or follow the venue regulations, you will not be entitled to a replacement or refund for your ticket. Entry to the venue shall constitute acceptance of the Guest Code of Conduct and venue regulations.

SIGN IN & LACE UP

REGISTRATION

Registration will be at the Auberge Royal Versailles on Thursday, September 1st, from 6:00 PM to 10:00 PM, at which time skaters, officials, and other credentialed participants will complete required paperwork and receive their tournament credentials.

Captains Meeting will be at the Auberge Royal Versailles on Thursday at 8:00 PM local time (Eastern). Officials Meeting will be at the Auberge Royal Versailles on Thursday at 9:00 PM local time (Eastern).

Credentials must be worn at all times in order to obtain access to the venue and to participant-only areas. There is a \$30 fee to replace lost or stolen credentials.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

The WFTDA as tournament host provides trained, certified emergency medical responders should an injury occur on the track. These staff may be a contracted service, venue provided, volunteers, and and/or team/league professionals. Only the staffed responders working their current shift may go onto the track or players' benches to access or treat a skater or official. Once removed from the playing area, if the skater or official wishes to use their own medical provider, s/he may refuse additional treatment.

Team/League medical staff seeking to treat their skaters on the track or bench must be part of, and sit with, the scheduled medical crew. For information on how to volunteer for the safety staff, please let your team's wrangler know so that they can notify the Safety Liaison. PLEASE NOTE: NOT ALL VENUES AND CONTRACTS PERMIT THE USE OF ADDITIONAL OR VOLUNTEER MEDICAL STAFF. The opportunity to participate in this capacity is not guaranteed and when not part of the prearranged schedule will not be permitted.

TEAM ROOMS

There will be four locker room areas and these will be assigned based on the tournament schedule. Please note these rooms will be shared by all teams. Please leave the team rooms in better condition than you found them.

There will be designated areas to leave your gear when not assigned a locker room and these will be in credential-only areas. Centre Pierre-Charbonneau, the WFTDA, and Montréal Roller Derby assume no responsibility for items left unattended.

There will be designated areas for officials, announcers, and credentialed photographers and media. Please clean up after yourselves since there are quite a large number of you using shared space.

TRACK FLOOR, WARM-UP SPACE, AND WARM-UP TIMES

The venue will be open by 8:00 AM Friday morning for skaters and officials who wish to test the floor. The track floor is sport court.

The regulation track takes up most of the arena floor so there will be no warm-up space aside from the actual track. Teams will be allowed to warm up on the track during the half time of the game prior to their own, as well as in the 10 minutes before the start of their game.

THINGS TO DO

Here are some fun things to do in our beautiful city! We also highly recommend picking a neighborhood like the Mile End, HoMa, or Saint-Henri to just walk around and take in your surroundings.

1. The world-renowned **Montréal Biodome, Botanical Garden** and **Insectarium** are only minutes away from the venue. The Biodome allows visitors to walk through four ecosystems from the Americas, including both flora and fauna; our Botanical Garden is considered to be one of the most important in the world; and the Insectarium is the largest insect museum in North America.
2. **Old Montréal** and the **Old Port** are a prime sightseeing spot! It's the oldest section of the city, a reminder of our New France past. While you could wander its streets for hours, you'll also find the Marché Bonsecours (local arts and crafts), Notre-Dame Basilica, and the Pointe-à-Callières Museum of Archeology and History.
3. The **Montréal Museum of Fine Arts'** four pavilions, situated in the city's historic Golden Square Mile, contain more than 41, 000 works of art. This includes pieces from the Middle Ages to the modern days from around the world, as well as archeological remains. One of its main collections focuses on Quebec and Canadian art. It also welcomes traveling exhibits from places as diverse as the Getty Museum, the Musée Rodin and the Metropolitan Museum of Art.
4. The **Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal**, the first one in Canada to be dedicated solely to contemporary art, is part of Place des Arts, a unique

cultural complex also focusing on the performing arts. The museum features works of art by over 1,200 artists that are still living, which include paintings, sculptures, photographs and installations.

5. The **Biosphere** is both an environment museum, and an architectural landmark left over from Montreal's 1967 World Fair. The geodesic dome it's housed in is a familiar part of our cityscape. As it is situated on Saint Helen's Island in the Saint Lawrence, you'll get a break from hectic city life. It features exhibits on the natural world, ecology, climate change and sustainable development.
6. The **Lachine Canal National Historic Site** is one of Montréal's best areas for outdoor activities. You can bike or skate on its 14-kilometer path, or enjoy the waters on kayak or canoe, all available for rental.
7. If you're looking for some nighttime fun, **Café Cléopâtre**, a downtown cabaret, hosts a strip karaoke night every first Saturday of the month. There's also **Montreal's First Friday**, where the city's best food trucks gather at the Olympic Stadium for some delicious food and music.

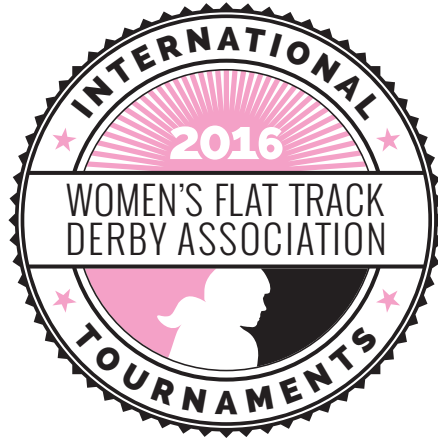
